Dear Dorothy -

I got sleepy before I started to write to you last night, so I'll write while the men are milking for Grandpa may go to Mt. Ayr and I'll have to have this ready 'cause we can't make any extra driving!

School begins at 9:00 now with only 30 min. at noon so they still get home at 4. We don't know yet whether the kids will have to walk or not - Guy said he had gas enough to drive this week then maybe they would know something but he waited all day in Mt. Ayr yesterday and then didn't get in to see about extra gas. If they have to walk there will be a lot of little kids stay at home because their dads won't have tires or gas to take them.

Ralph Roe sold his stock of machinery yesterday - they are moving to Brookfield the first of the year. They were down for Thanksgiving dinner.

Grandpa & Grandma went to Centerville with King & stayed till Friday night. Stuart & Helen were there & took them over to Bloomfield to see Rev. Eastman. It was too stormy to shuck corn so Daddy did the chores & ran around - Leland came up & shucked corn Saturday & Louie Harris.

Naomi is coming home - leaves Dec. 4. She planned to come  
to Omaha with some friends last week but they gave it up so  
she is coming this week & visit a few days then on to Chicago  
as John is stationed about 40 mi. north of Chicago. She  
might get a job & stay in Chicago while he is there - I  
don't know what her plans are. Oren wants Fred & Gladys  
to go to San Francisco - they have the house all fixed up  
so it should be easy to rent or sell.

I've only seen one passenger car go by this morning. They  
were all out yesterday getting their tanks filled. The La Salle  
is at Allendale still but hope to get it right away - it has  
a full tank of gas if someone hasn't used it!

What do you want for Xmas? I'd like to know so I can

order or I might get a chance to go somewhere - maybe as far as Grant or Mt. Ayr.

Well I must get busy & clean up & wash dishes etc. etc. Sun is shining so I should have washed but maybe it will be nice tomorrow.

Madge & Cleo were in La City last weekend. I wish I'd known it - I'd have sent a box of food. Stogle isn't well yet though he works - his side hasn't healed entirely yet & keeps draining. Paul was deferred till Dec 12 & hadn't heard yet when he would be called. Jimmie leaves St. M. today for Great Lakes. Cleo has passed her physical exam & may have to go soon. So Madge says she guesses she will have to go to Chicago & get a job. She has her teeth all out & hopes for new ones right away.
