

Some "facts" about descendants
The ADAIR family name in my online tree goes back to John ADAIR (1732-1827). He was born in Antrim, Northern Ireland and died in Knoxville, Tennessee. This is difficult to verify with so many named "JOHN ADAIR".

The next generation down is more likely true. My 4th great-grandfather John Adair was born 15 Feb 1750 in Limerick, County Down, Ireland but that may be Down, County Limerick, Ireland. He died 1 Nov 1824 in Madison County, Ohio. I find 2 marriages, Mary O'Donnell in 1773 (5 children) and Elizabeth McKnight in 1791 (6 children).
