fever, is not expected to live.

Halfield now, were here one afternoon.
Ray has 13 months to serve yet his
company are going to start for the
Philippine Islands about April 1. he
don't know how long he will be gone
said if the opportunities were good
he was going in some business over
there when he served his time in the
Army. Min and Carter are all well,
Grandma Hyle was quite sick but is
better now. Mr Rankin and wife are back
from the West, they are going back again
soon, have not seen them yet.
