Sam is going to Blockton I will send it over with him.

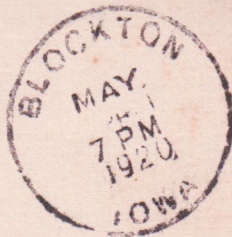
Sam was down to Grant City and seen Miss Craven she told Sam she herd that he was going to have a new sister. I guess that is all true.
