



Native son of Redding, Iowa from where the roots of innovation, resourcefulness, neighborliness, and family were nurtured. Graduate of the University of Iowa and U.S. Air Force Officer Candidate School.

Insurance and commercial real estate broker and investor; co-founder of the Montessori Schools movement in Omaha; founder of the Consortium for Dementia Alternatives; Nursery Mat early childhood center; & on and on.... (and he had about a million more ideas just waiting to embrace any partner willing to jump on board and have fun building something meaningful together). John Adair was a "one man think-tank" and perhaps the world's greatest champion of Connect-the-Dots — webbing together ideas, individuals' talents and motivations, the possibilities, and their greater purpose.

Every moment in John's life was a joyful exercise of finding ways to elevate others through his wisdom, innovation, enthusiasm, and personal support.
