

The **Federal Census 1900** (taken on June 1, 1900 states she was living in Brunswick Township, Maine with her mother Ella and her uncle Frank. Her father died when she was 8 months old.

The **Federal Census 1910** (taken April 15, 1920) states she was living in the household of her uncle Frank Cartland, and his wife Mary, and their children Marian and Laurence in Saco, Maine.

The **Federal Census 1920** (taken on January 12, 1920) states she was living in Des Moines, Iowa with her mother, who, by then, had married Richard Marshall.

The Federal Censuses 1930, 1940, and 1950 states she was living with husband Earl Adair in Clinton Township, Ringgold County, Iowa.

Here is a tribute to Mary written by her son John.

Mary Cartland Bailey Adair

June 7, 1894 - November 27, 1975

A Redding Iowa Quaker

Mary came to Redding Iowa as a teacher of Home Economics at the Redding High School in 1919. This where she met Earl.

At the end of the year she vowed that she would never come back to Redding and went to teach in Casey, Iowa. After a year of wooing she returned to spend their life together. Her famous saying, "Never say Never".

Mary was born in Lisbon Falls, Maine and the family religious relationship was with the Durham Meeting house of the Society of Friends. The Quaker group.

The Cartlands have a long history within the Quaker faith.

Mary had another saying if you hadn't found an answer to a decision, "Let your conscience be your guide."

Education was the DNA of the Cartlands. Education has a universal power to eliminate biases, prejudices and accept that human being as being made in God's image.

Speaking to God directly anywhere was natural and teaching was important to their worthiness. Their word had a tone of gospel, an act of giving a transforming messages to others.

Mary was a perfect fit, never outwardly showing her faith but living it was her life pattern making her a touchstone for

others to come to her for working out what was the right thing to do in situations. Mary always felt that if you could discuss things together openly that a decision could be reached.

Here is an example of her teaching behavior. She was teaching Home Ec. to a group of boys. This day it was pie baking. Some of the boys were acting up. When the pies were finished they got to eat their pie, all except the ones that weren't behaving properly. After that, her class had no behavior problems. They learned that their actions do have consequences.

There are many words that describe Mary; Love, Harmony, Friendship and a trace of Free Spirit. A spirit that is not harnessed to an ideology or human differences, but guided by her conscience to determine the right thing to do.

This philosophy of the Quakers is well represented by their name.

The Society of Friends.

The Proviso Township Senior Citizen Club published an interview for the Melrose Park Herald, December 23, 1987. This is Margaret's story.

Margaret Kruse grew up on a farm in southern lowa, not far from the Missouri border. There was no electricity or running water on the property the 66-year-old Melrose Park residents' parents owned.

"One Christmas at my school's party, my grab bag gift was both a live chicken and rooster. I took them home and they ruled the roost. I went with my family to church on Christmas Eve, where I got an apple and orange.

"My family had to do all the chores before we could come in and open our gifts. We used to get up around 4 or 4:30 a.m., but we cheated on Christmas Day and got up around 5 a.m. My sister and I would run into the living room and peek under the tree to see where our packages were and then went out to do our chores.

"My job was milking the cows, and I would bundle up and go to the barn with a lantern and milk as many as 10 cows before coming into the house. I'd do it about 45 minutes to one hour, which was much faster than usual. My sister would hand turn the separator, a machine that would separate the milk from the cream. Then we had a big breakfast - sorghum and biscuits and gravy - and then went into the living room and opened our gifts."



She went to grade school and high school in Redding. Her early years include artistry, spelling, sports, and actress.

After high school, Margaret attended Capital City Community College (CCCC) business school in Des Moines, Iowa. She found time for basketball.








