DANDELION




When failure seems our lot, think of the dandelion. Its deep root survives to grow again, with a cheerful bloom.

GRAPES




When feeling crushed by life's circumstances, reflect on the grapes that undergo crushing to become sweet wine.



The Lord will give thee grace and glory. Psalm 84:11


PINE TREE

When assailed with sleeplessness and worry, try dialing these scriptures for help. God is listening and will answer, because He cares for you.




ROOTS and BULBS

ROSE




The rose that rises above its thorny branch in splendor of beauty and fragrance has become a symbol of love.

Freely ye have received, freely give. Matthew 10:8


SONGBIRDS

He restoreth my soul. Psalm 32:3


SUNFLOWER
